Dear carers and supporters,

We were delighted to see such a wonderful turnout for our Carers Festival event this summer. To see so many familiar faces and to introduce dozens of new carers to the support services that are available in our city was wonderful. They have also supported and signposted many more carers from neighbouring counties. Incredible when you consider that before the project began, we were averaging just 50 referrals per year from hospital sources. ## **Accessing Health Services**

#### Have you heard of the pharmacy First scheme?

The government and NHS England launched the Pharmacy First scheme in January 2024 to give patients quick and accessible care and ease pressure on GP services.

In participating pharmacies, patients can now get treatment for seven common conditions. This means you won't need to get a GP appointment or prescription first.

If you have symptoms that suggest you may have one of the following conditions, you can now walk into a pharmacy and be offered a consultation with the pharmacist.

- Sinusitis for children and adults aged 12 years and over;
- Sore throat for children and adults aged 5 years and over;
- Earache (Acute otitis media) for children aged 1 to 17 years;
- Infected insect bite for children and adults aged 1 year and over;
- Impetigo for children and adults aged 1 year and over;
- Shingles for adults aged 18 years and over; and
- Uncomplicated urinary tract infections in women aged 16 to 64 years.

The pharmacist will be able to speak to you privately in a separate room. They may perform an examination or ask to access your medical records. Under this new service, the pharmacist can offer advice and recommend the best course of action on an individual patient basis. If clinically necessary, they will offer NHS prescription medication for treatment. This can include prescriptions for antibiotics or antivirals. The NHS prescription charges apply if you normally pay for medicines supplied on prescription.

The pharmacy team will direct you to your GP surgery or A&E as appropriate, if they are unable to help.

Patients can still choose to visit a GP if they wish to. Pharmacy First offers alternative access for these seven conditions and the government encourages people to make the most of this service.

## Help with costs





In May, NHS prescription charges increased to £9.90 for each prescribed item. If you need to take prescription medication regularly – unless you qualify for free NHS prescriptions – the costs for medication can quickly add up. You may be able to reduce your costs by buying a Prescription Prepayment Certificate (PPC). If you have a PPC, you do not have to pay for any of your NHS prescriptions during the period covered. This includes NHS prescriptions from your dentist.

How much you would be able to save depends on the number of prescriptions you have to pay for in a 3-month or a 12-month period.

So, let's look at the cost for PPCs, to see whether you would save money.

PPC type	Cost for PPC	Worth it if you need more than	Examples	
3-month PPC	£32.05	3 items in 3 months	3 prescriptions cost £29.70	4 prescriptions cost £39.60
12-month PPC	£114.50	11 items in 12 months	11 prescriptions cost £108.90	12 prescriptions cost £118.80
12-month HRT PPC	£19.80	2 items in 12 months	2 prescriptions cost £19.80	3 prescriptions cost £29.70

You can also buy PPCs on someone else's behalf, e.g. as a carer, you can buy a PPC for the person you support.

You can buy a PPC by calling 0300 330 1341 or online on the NHS BSA website www.nhsbsa.nhs.uk/help-nhs-prescription-costs/nhs-prescription-prepayment-certificate-ppc where you can also find further information.

You can also buy PPCs in pharmacies.

Before buying a PPC, it might be worth checking if you qualify for free NHS prescriptions, either via the NHS BSA website <a href="https://check-for-help-paying-nhs-costs.nhs.uk/start">https://check-for-help-paying-nhs-costs.nhs.uk/start</a> or by calling the above number.

The Carers Hub is a partnership with the Carers Centre, Alzheimers Society, Cross Roads Care, B&H City Council and the NHS and is the first point of contact for Carers in the city.
